Tips:

- Have a vision for what patrons will be creating.
- Use "Guided Access" on iPads.
- Work with schools/organizations in the area (Colleges, High School Technology Classes and Teachers, YMCA, & Film Centers) . It is possible to link up with local filmmakers with a shared vision to maximize potential for library programs.
- Have fun. If you are not enjoying it, chances are patrons will not either.
- Utilize video streaming services, such as YouTube to feature student content and not use network bandwidth.
- Go with the flow of the program. If students appear to be interested in a particular topic, dissect it if possible.
- Award students of program in some way for their efforts (certificates, food, etc.)
- Have a showing of content film screening, open to the community.
- Find a variety of help and training resources to guide you through your digital media projects. Make sure that you have a collection of technology reference books pertaining to available hardware and software.
- Subscribe to online resources that contain thousands of training videos, technology textbooks, and beginner's guides such as <u>Lynda.com</u> <u>Atomic Learning</u> and <u>SafariBooks</u>.
- Visit other spaces that offer digital media learning both physically and virtually.
