

Organizational Commitment

- > An environmental policy has been added our policy manual
- > employee job descriptions include green practices
- ➤ Our annual employee review process includes criteria for adhering to sustainable practices

- Our contractors and suppliers will be made aware of our commitment and will be encouraged to meet our standards of environmental performance.
- Our hope is that our employees and patrons alike will take notice of our commitment to the environment and carry that over to their personal lives.

Staff Survey & Green Team

- Of our 38 employees, 36 responded to the survey
- ▶ 94% believe HHFL to be and environmentally friendly workplace
- The employees believe our efforts should focus on energy, recycling, paper use and green purchasing
- As a result of the survey, the green team's challenge is to develop a plan to better inform all employees of current and future green initiatives

- We installed a ceiling cassette in the circulation area for heating/cooling so as not to keep the main unit running unnecessarily.
- We installed a variable frequency drive to the main air handler to reduce energy draw.
- All computer equipment has been plugged into power strips that are shut off when not in use.


Energy

- We installed LED lighting in parking lot.
- ➤ WE installed LED lighting in 95% of the building
- All our thermostats are set on timers with preset temperatures.
- All of our bathroom light fixtures have an auto on-off sensor

Materials Management Purchasing

- Researched and implemented purchasing of green alternatives for all our cleaning supplies
- ➤ All paper products we purchase are recycled with a minimum of 30% postconsumer content
- Our cleaning products are Certified Green Seal; no chlorine, phosphates, acids, caustics or petroleum-based ingredients
- We buy in bulk and use refillable sugar, salt, etc.
- ➤ We aim to use all-natural soaps, buy cleaners in concentrated formulas and eliminate the use of aerosol sprays
- ➤ We have eliminated the purchase of disposable dishes and utensils for staff and most programing







Water

- Our sprinkler system is on a timer with moisture sensors so they don't come on if it has recently rained
- We are monitoring the water meter on a weekly basis
- ➤ We installed auto-shut off faucets in all restrooms
- We installed signs in the kitchen areas reminding staff and patrons to be sure they turn off faucets completely





Transportation

- ➤ We encourage carpooling and alternate methods of transportation, e.g.: bicycling, walking
- ➤ Bike rack

Hendrick Hudson Library goes green

MONTROSE - The Hendrick Hudson Free Library in Montrose was recently honored by The New York State Regents Advisory Council with the 2016 Joseph F. Shubert Library Excellence Award. Given annually, the award recognizes the achievements of small, medium and large libraries in New York State that have taken significant steps within the past two years to improve the quality of library service to the community they serve. The library received this honor for being the first library in Westchester County to achieve their official Green Business Certification. The library has taken the following steps to achieving

a green status: using LED lights in the entire building, including the parking lot, using compost for staff waste and working on installing 275 solar panels on the the new construction and addition to the children's room which will open




